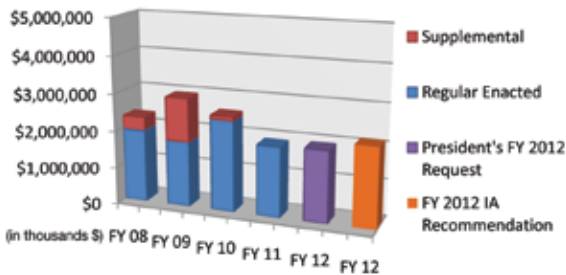




Supporting Multilateral Institutions and Peacekeeping

Contributions to International Peacekeeping Activities

(\$2.146 billion recommended)



Through this account, the United States provides essential support to UN peacekeeping missions.

Justification: \$2.146 billion is required to pay our UN peacekeeping dues in full. By helping to support these operations, the U.S. stands with and leverages the contributions of other countries to help further U.S. foreign policy objectives in volatile regions. UN peacekeeping missions work to support and implement the terms of ceasefires and peace agreements, support elections, create safe space for the delivery of humanitarian assistance, build government capacity and protect people from genocide, war crimes, ethnic cleansing and crimes against humanity.

International Organizations and Programs

(\$348.7 million recommended)

The United States is obligated to fulfill its pledged contributions to UN-affiliated agencies, such as UNICEF, the World Food Program and others listed below:

- **UNICEF** (\$134 million)
- **United Nations Development Program** (\$71.535 million)
- **United Nations Population Fund** (\$47.5 million)
- **Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change / UN Framework Convention on Climate Change** (\$13.5 million)
- **United Nations Women** (\$8 million)
- **UN HABITAT** (\$1.9 million)
