Piloting the GBV Prevention Evaluation Framework

Norms for Engagement

In January 2022, InterAction will begin facilitating a Community of Practice for practitioners actively piloting or with plans to pilot the [GBV Prevention Evaluation Framework](#) (GBV PEF). The Community of Practice will have two platforms: 1) an online forum and 2) regular calls. By participating in the online forum or the calls, participants agree to uphold and respect the following norms for engagement. InterAction is ultimately responsible for ensuring that participants are engaging in a way that is in line with these norms.



Active

Engage frequently! We are all learning. Ask questions, respond to others' queries, and share resources. This community is an opportunity to share challenges you are facing and successes you are having. Sharing your experiences will help improve the GBV PEF. Silently lurking is discouraged. Everyone has something to contribute to the community—and its success depends on every participant actively engaging.



Safe

Respect “Chatham House Rule.” Use the information received through the community but refrain from naming specific individuals, organizations, and contexts. Additionally, do not share personal information from participants' profiles or that is shared in the group without explicit consent from that individual.



Inclusive

Help us welcome new participants to the community and ensure their voices are included in discussions. Respectfully disagree if ideas and opinions do not align.



Focused

Keep conversations, sharing of resources, and overall engagement focused on themes related to the piloting of the GBV PEF.



Accessible

Help ensure discussions are accessible to everyone, including speakers of other languages, by utilizing simple language from the outset to facilitate sharing among ourselves and broader networks.
