Dr. Sheila Davis
CEO, Partners in Health

Dr. Sheila Davis is the Chief Executive Officer of Partners In Health (PIH), a global health organization rooted in social justice. An adult nurse practitioner by training, she earned her Doctor of Nursing Practice in global health from the MGH Institute of Health Professions and has spent her career advancing equitable access to quality health care.

Before joining PIH, she spent more than 15 years as a clinical leader in HIV/AIDS care at the Infectious Diseases Clinic at Massachusetts General Hospital. Since joining PIH, she has served as Chief of Ebola Response, Chief of Clinical Operations, and Chief Nursing Officer before becoming CEO in 2019. She also serves on the faculty of the UCSF School of Nursing and the University of Global Health Equity in Rwanda.



Stephanie Psaki, Ph.D.
Senior Fellow for Global Health, Council on Foreign Relations

Dr. Psaki is an expert on the intersection of global health and U.S. foreign policy. She recently served as the inaugural U.S. coordinator for global health security at the National Security Council, where she coordinated the U.S. government's response to biological threats. Previously, she co-founded a global research center focused on adolescent

health and opportunity at the Population Council, and worked at NIH, Partners in Health, and FHI 360. She has written on global health security, population health, and U.S. foreign policy in *The Atlantic*, *Time* magazine, *STAT News*, *Vox*, and her research has been published in top academic journals. She is a senior fellow at the Council on Foreign Relations, and chairs the AIDS Vaccine Advocacy Coalition's board of directors.


Jirair Ratevosian

Research Scholar, Duke Global Health Institute

Dr. Jirair Ratevosian is a public health scientist and policy leader whose career spans government, academia, industry, and advocacy, shaping global HIV policy and advancing health equity. He is a Research Scholar at the Duke Global Health Institute and a Senior Associate (Non-resident) with the Global Health Policy Center at the Center for Strategic and International Studies. He advises organizations advancing HIV elimination, artificial intelligence, and health delivery innovation. Previously, he served as Acting Chief of Staff and Senior Health Equity Advisor to the U.S. Global AIDS Coordinator and helped lead U.S. engagement in the Global Fund's Seventh Replenishment. He has held roles at Gilead Sciences, amfAR, and in Congress for Representative Barbara Lee. He writes the Lights, Camera, Equity newsletter on Substack and has published in POZ, TheBody, TIME, The Lancet, and Playboy. He holds a DrPH from Johns Hopkins University, an MPH from Boston University, and undergraduate degrees from UCLA.


Bill Steiger

CEO, Malaria No More

Dr. Bill Steiger is the Chief Executive Officer of Malaria No More (MNM). Prior to this role, he served as Chief of Staff at the U.S. Agency for International Development under Administrator Mark Green during the first Trump Administration. He previously led Pink Ribbon Red Ribbon, a public-private partnership hosted by the Bush Institute focused on fighting cervical and breast cancer in developing countries. From 2001 to 2009, Dr. Steiger directed the Office of Global Health Affairs at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and served as Special Assistant for International Affairs to the Secretary. He also served on governing bodies of the World Health Organization, Pan American Health Organization, and Global Fund.


Lisa Bos

Vice President for Policy and Government Relations, InterAction

Lisa Bos is the Vice President for Policy and Government Relations at InterAction, the largest U.S.-based alliance of international NGOs and partners. She leads InterAction's advocacy and education efforts with Congress and the Administration and serves on the Executive Team. In addition, she oversees a government relations and policy team focused on supporting InterAction's members and their priorities in Washington, DC. Lisa has testified before the House Foreign Affairs Committee and been featured in media outlets including CNN International, Devex, NOTUS, NPR, the Religion News Service, and Time Magazine.

Prior to joining InterAction, Lisa was the Senior Director of Government Relations at World Vision, where she spent 13 years. Lisa spent nearly 9 years as a legislative staff person in the U.S. House of Representatives, including 3 years as Policy Director for the Republican Study Committee, the largest caucus in Congress. In this role, Ms. Bos analyzed legislation and worked closely with committees and House Leadership. Ms. Bos has also worked in the

private sector, serving as a Vice President at Cassidy & Associates and as an Account Director at Russ Reid.

Ms. Bos is a native of Michigan and a graduate of Hope College in Holland, Michigan. She currently resides in Falls Church, VA.
